The following reports on activities for the period shown:

CURRENT SITUATION

- -The FDNY continues to monitor the outbreak of COVID-19 and its effects on the population of New York City as well as the departments members.
- -The top priorities for the FDNY are to protect the workforce, ensure continuity in the PPE supply chain, provide COVID-19 messaging to all employees and maintain a call center for all FDNY members that BHS places in the monitoring program.
- -As reported by the FDNY Bureau of Health Services the FDNY currently has 206 (Fire 171 EMS 35) employees who have tested positive for COVID-19.
- -The Executive dashboard from FDNY GIS is currently shared with the FDNY IMT to track fever/cough responses throughout the day.
- -During the operational period from 0000hrs to 0900hrs there were a total of 77 fever/cough runs responded to.
- -Diamond Plate has a link on the front page containing COVID-19 information.
- -FDNY IMT is tasked with providing COVID-19 specific PPE to the following locations: Battalion Chief firehouse locations, EMS Divisions, EMS Academy, Fire Academy, PSAC 1, PSAC 2, BHS, Family Assistance Unit, EMS Bronx Tactical, EMS Queens Tactical, Haz-Tac Battalion, OMA, FDOC, Pharmacy, and Rikers Island to adequately supply PPE to protect the workforce. Any requests from other units or bureaus will be considered on a case by case basis.
- -Cleaning companies have started to disinfect Firehouses & EMS stations. Priority will be based on how many members from those Firehouses and EMS stations have the most COVID-19+ members.
- -Providing access to updated data and timely reports for FDNY Executive Staff and the workforce.
- -The FDNY IMT continues to produce a daily update to keep FDNY employees informed of pertinent incident information.
- -FDNY IMT has an active call center to track FDNY employees being monitored by BHS.
- -Continue to identify alternate supply chain options to meet FDNY PPE needs while consolidating Operations & Logistical resources.
- -FDNY GIS continually creating digital survey forms to further support operations for situational awareness and proper planning based on real time information received.

- Yesterday was a historic day for EMS call volume with a total of 6,043 call received.

CRITICAL ISSUES

- -Monitor Burn Rate and estimate potential Burn Rate based on new treatment and response protocols.
- -N95 mask supply & demand will be strictly enforced. Target rate 300 per day. Additional N95 masks needed will be approved by the Chief of Operations for Fire units or the Chief of Operations for EMS units

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- -For yesterday's operational period 84 deliveries were made of those 1 were after the days operational period.
- -The new SCBA Decon procedure has been submitted to Fire & EMS members of the department.
- -A donation of 51,000 N95 masks have been delivered to the FDNY.
- -FDNY apparatus will be disinfected when they are taken for Preventative maintenance.
- -FDNY & EMS members who are nurses have been approved to assist BHS.
- -A video on APR usage has been placed on Diamond Plate for Fire & EMS members to review.

PLANNED ACTIVITIES (next 24 – 72 hours)

- -Logistics will be demobilizing vehicles no longer needed.
- -Call center bravo will be created at BHS and will be staffed with light duty officers.
- -No touch thermal thermometers at PSAC 1, PSAC 2 & FDOC will be in operation next week.
